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About Gahwara

Gahwara is a non-profit organization, working to compose, write and translate children storybooks into Persian-Dari, Pashto and Uzbeki languages, establishing a valuable source of educative and entertainment materials for children in Afghanistan. Gahwara members are professional translators, writers, poets and artists who have several years of experience in their respected fields, reside in Afghanistan and various parts of the world, many of whom contribute voluntarily.

Gahwara is the only organization in Afghanistan that works in this field. It has published more than 80 books online, as well as printed and distributed more than 37000 books from different titles over a short period of time. Gahwara's dedicated work quickly caught the attention of media and well-known organizations, and reached thousands of children living inside and outside Afghanistan.







Objectives

- By composing stories, we help children learn the values of life, such as, friendship, family, hope, love, peace, reconciliation, gender equality, creativity, honesty, sense of responsibility towards community and humanity in general and much more. To reach this goal, our new generation ought to have access to variety of books. By providing storybooks to our children we provide them with the opportunity to learn about their own as well as other countries, cultures, and societies.
- Storytelling forms a crucial part of childhood cognitive development. It stimulates early brain development and helps build key language, literacy and social skills in children. With children's brain development occurring the fastest between birth and age three, this period is especially important for setting stage not just for future learning and intellectual success, but also for children's emotional wellbeing. Storytelling also ignites children's curiosity, enhances their imaginative skills, and gives them new perception about the world.
- We aim to help our children learn new values and shared memories that promote tolerance, multiculturalism, diversity, gender equality and compassion.

Statement of Need

Prolonged war, destruction, disruption in educational system, mass migrations and poverty are some of the main reasons for lacking resources to develop appropriate storybooks for children. Children's storybooks are one of the main sources of storytelling. War and destruction have left many generations of Afghanistan's children without stories, fictional characters, heroes and mental activities that could stimulate their curiosity and imagination.

Technical Approach

Gahwara composes/writes, translate and publishes stories in three major official languages for children in Afghanistan.

Program implementation includes::

- Develop a comprehensive action plan that includes clear actions with achievable timeframe after consultation with all technical members of Gahwara;
- Develop a comprehensive action plan that clearly states members' activities within achievable time-frame;
- 3 Composing stories and translating stories from foreign languages into official languages;
- 4 Storybook Design;
- Text Revision/Editing;
- Illustration/Picture Editing;
- Book Editing;
- Printing & Publishing;
- Oistribution to the targeted points;
- Presenting the storybooks;
- 4 And program impact assessment.

The storybooks could be accessible in three formats: paper copies, PDFs and Audio clips and very soon by short animation movies. The distribution points are among public schools, kindergartens, libraries and related elementary educative associations in all over Afghanistan. Hence, it is available for children in all geographic zones especially for those living in rural and underprivileged areas.







Example of Previous Works

Gahwara has implemented several educational projects. Below highlights one of the recent projected completed in 2019:

Felissimo's donation to support female/children in difficult situation due to conflicts. Gahwara composed a story by the name of the Play-Doh City in Pashto and distributed 1,250 copies in the primary schools in Pashto speaking areas, as well as certain children/girls associations in Kabul and Baghlan Provinces.Likewise, the Magic Sack Story was translated from Russian into Persian-Dari, printed in 1250 copies and distributed among primary schools in Persian-Dari speaking areas as well as certain children/girls' associations in Kabul and Herat Provinces.





Impact

Gahwara measures the impact of its projects by collecting feedbacks in the form of survey, questionnaires and reviews on a regular basis. The questionnaires and feedbacks are regularly evaluated by a team of our experts to keep track of project progress and accomplishments.











Innovative

As the only children foundation that publishes storybooks in Afghanistan, Gahwara does not only serve children inside Afghanistan but also continues to provide E-books on downloadable PDF files as well as Audio clips accessible online for free. This initiative, the first of its type, has created a platform for Afghan diaspora around the world to help their children learn their native language.
